Virginia Bankers Association Education Foundation to Award \$26,000 to 2017 Bank Day Scholarship Program Essay Contest Winners

Glen Allen – The Virginia Bankers Association (VBA) Education Foundation has announced the winners of the 2017 VBA Bank Day Scholarship Program. After spending a day shadowing at one of the 33 banks that participated across the Commonwealth, students were asked to write an essay about their experience for the opportunity to win a college scholarship. The six regional winners will now be entered into the statewide essay contest. The winner of the statewide contest will receive an additional \$5,000, and receive \$7,500 total for their college education.

"The VBA Bank Day Scholarship Program allows students to see firsthand the way banks operate and how they serve their communities," said VBA President and CEO Bruce Whitehurst. "The twelve students who won scholarships through this program were chosen from the 402 students who participated in total. Their essays showed that the Bank Day experience helped them to gain an understanding of how banking works and how important it is to be equipped with effective money management skills. We are proud of these students' achievements and wish them all the best as they begin their college careers."

VBA Bank Day is a statewide effort sponsored by the VBA Education Foundation and the VBA Emerging Bank Leaders. Bank Day began when the third Tuesday in March was declared Bank Day by the Virginia General Assembly in 1991. The purpose of the day is to expose students to the banking industry and provide an opportunity for the students to learn about banking, financial services and the vital role banks play in their communities.
