## **2023** General Assembly Potential Legislation

- Bank Franchise Tax The VBA established a Bank Franchise Tax Work Group to consider potential modernization changes to the tax. The Group identified process improvements including electronic filing, potential centralized filing through the state, a filing extension option, and more robust guidance. They also identified electronic access to property assessments at local Commissioners of Revenue systems. For centralized filing, the current potential proposal would be an optional method for those banks with over \$40 Billion in Virginia deposits. Once collected by the state, 80% of the BFT fund collected from those banks who have elected the centralized method will be allocated to localities based on population.
- **Permissible Investments** Virginia currently has more restrictive statutes on permissible investments by state-chartered banks than other states and for national bank charters. An update to the statute is necessary for clarity on RBIC investments, updates to match OCC guidelines, and other investment vehicles that have evolved over the years. Senator Lynwood Lewis and Delegate Israel O'Quinn will introduce the bills.
- Stimulus Garnishments Protections enacted during the pandemic for federal stimulus payments should be subject to a sunset clause. Senator Chap Petersen and Delegate Jay Leftwich will introduce the bills.
- CDFI Fund A Virginia CDFI Fund was created and funded with \$10M in 2021. The fund
  was over-subscribed, and no additional funds were appropriated in 2022. As part of the VA
  CDFI Coalition, the VBA will support legislation to gain additional, ongoing state financial
  support for CDFI efforts in small business, affordable housing, and community development
  efforts. Delegate Danny Marshall and Senator Jennifer McClellan will introduce the bills and
  potentially the budget amendments.
- Credit Unions The VBA will continue to oppose any legislative efforts by state-chartered credit unions to expand their powers beyond parity with federal credit unions.
- Forced Access Several other states have seen legislation that injects government into a bank's decision on who to serve in response to the perceived action or lack of action at the federal level on climate change and other social issues. Proposals include penalizing banks that choose not to serve the fossil fuel or firearm industry, prohibiting the use of social credit scoring, and divesting of state funds from companies that do business with fossil fuel companies. Virginia's Attorney General joined with other Republican AGs in a civil investigation demand of six national banks regarding their ESG practices. A national conservative state legislative organization is promoting a model bill that would eliminate state contracts with firms that "boycott" certain industries, mainly fossil fuel companies. The VBA should oppose any legislation that restricts or penalizes banks for choosing whether or not to do business with any legal potential customer.
- ATM Fee Caps A northern Virginia legislator reached out to the VBA with interest in capping the transaction fees at independently operated ATMs. In reviewing her draft proposal, she specifically exempts financial institutions and does not apply the fee cap on those charged by card issuer banks for using a non-bank ATM.

- Mechanics Liens The Association of General Contractors has requested VBA feedback on potential changes to the mechanics lien process. They would like to change the timeline to file the lien from 90 to 120 days, consistent with most other states. They also propose eliminating the 150-day lookback period on what amounts the contractor may claim on the lien. The VBA received feedback from lenders who expressed concern over the changes impact on lender lien rights which have been communicated to the contractors.
- Guardians Ad Litem The Virginia Academy of Elder Law Attorneys approached the VBA with a proposal to require banks to provide financial information to Guardians Ad Litem. They proposed a 5-day turnaround timeline with penalties for noncompliance. We have made alternative language suggestions, including making the timeline 14 days, removing the penalties, and requiring a copy of the court order when the GAL makes the request. They declined, so we will oppose the bill.
